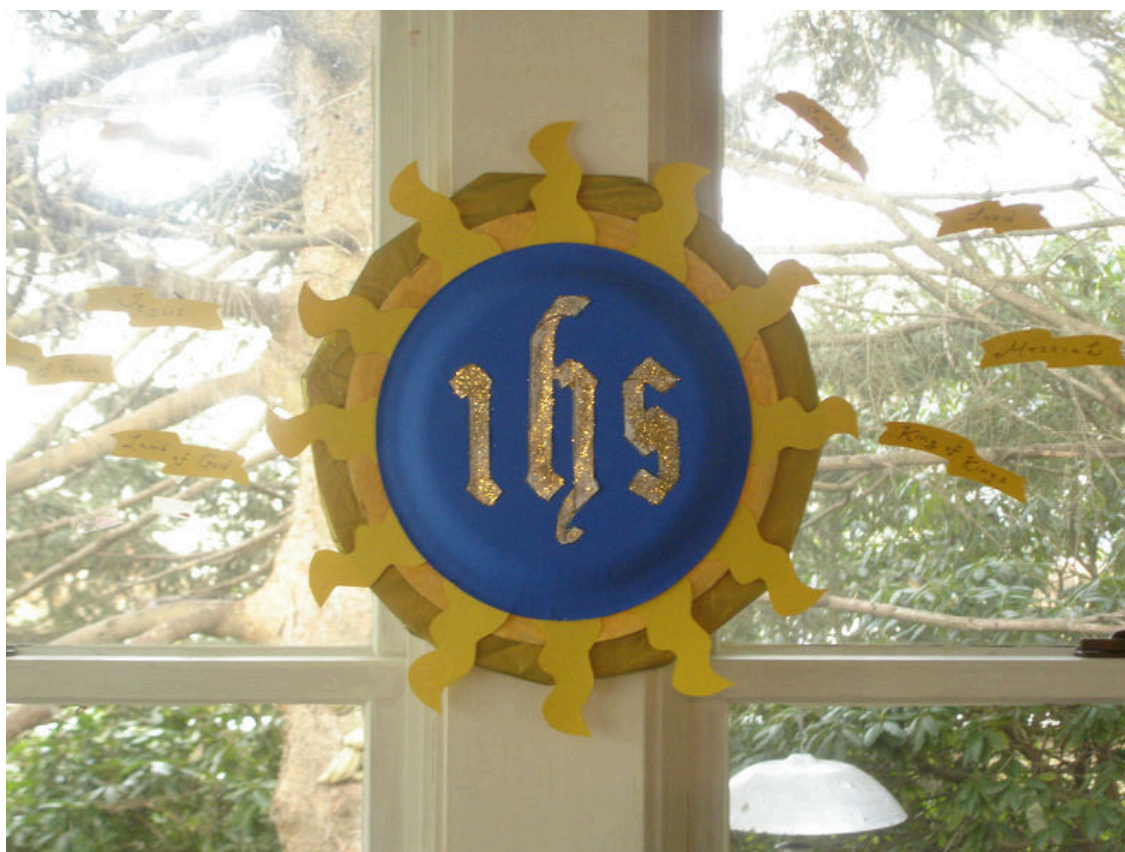


January and the Holy Name of Jesus
